HAWORTH VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE CORPS

The Haworth Volunteer Ambulance Corps is proud to serve our community and very much appreciates the support and contributions provided by our residents. Please know that the services HVAC provide are free of charge to anyone needing emergency care. Do not ever hesitate to call 911 in an emergency.

We are always looking for new members and encourage you to consider becoming a member either as a driver or EMT. All training and education is provided free of charge to qualified volunteers whether as junior (age 16 or older) or adult members. All we require is a sincere desire to learn the skills necessary to become a member and a commitment to actively serve your community.

Our members meet regularly on Sunday mornings at the Ambulance building on Park Street from 10 AM to 12 Noon. Please stop by to meet your volunteer neighbors, learn more about our services, and how to join the HVAC. We also encourage everyone to become properly trained in CPR techniques, the lifesaving skills that need to be provided as quickly as possible in critical emergencies. CPR classes are offered free of charge for residents. The HVAC also has, free of charge to residents, equipment such as crutches, walkers, commodes and wheelchairs that may be borrowed for medical, rehabilitation or long care needs.

We look forward to having you visit. We are honored to be part of the services along with the Police and Fire Departments that keep our community safe.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Department of Public Works has cleaned many of the Borough lots of the debris, overgrowth, limbs and dead trees that have made these areas unsightly. Inasmuch as we have worked to improve these areas, and Ordinance No. 810 prohibits dumping on public property, and calls for fines of \$250.00 to \$500.00, we would ask you to please not dump in these areas. Also, if you see someone dumping, PLEASE call the police immediately. This will save Haworth residents a great deal of money and help keep Haworth looking beautiful.

PROPANE TANKS Please bring propane tanks to the Household Hazardous Waste Collections (1 lb. And 20 lb. tanks only) or contact either Modern Propane located on Route 46 West in Lodi, NJ (973) 778-0812 or Suburban Propane located on Route 17, Mahwah, NJ (201) 529-3500 for propane tank removal. Thank you for your cooperation.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES: Household battery manufacturers have begun manufacturing alkaline batteries with no added mercury and have reduced the amount of mercury added to other batteries. Alkaline batteries now fall below Federal and State hazardous waste standards and can be disposed of in the regular trash. Batteries that must be recycled are rechargeable batteries found in cell phones, cordless phones, cordless power tools, laptop computers, digital cameras and remote-control toys.



The label on the battery will indicate if it is rechargeable. If it says "Alkaline", dispose of it in the trash.

Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at participating retail locations including the following: Radio Shack, Best Buy, Staples, Target, Office Max, Lowes, Home Depot, Sears, Wal-Mart and Verizon Wireless. Recycling



The more you recycle, the better it is for the environment and for your tax bill.
Please remember paper now has to be separate from glass, plastic and aluminum.

Paper Products including coffee cups, newspapers, magazines, catalogues, junk mail, coupons, envelopes (plastic windows need **not** be removed), writing paper, printer paper, gift wrap, tissue paper, brown paper bags, gift bags, books, hard cover books, paperbacks, telephone books, cardboard egg cartons, cardboard and corrugated boxes, **including PIZZA boxes**, unsoiled paper towels and napkins.

Plastic of any size or shape with numbers 1, 2 or 5.

Glass, including jars & bottles. **NO PLATE GLASS or LIGHT BULBS.**

Aluminum, steel & tin in the form of cans (coffee, soda, tennis ball, pet food, etc.) aluminum foil, metal bottle caps, foil wrappers for candy and snack bars, chip bags, etc. **NO METAL HANGERS.**

ALL FOOD CONTAINERS/PACKAGING MUST BE RINSED.

No plastic bags of any kind, frozen food microwave trays, pesticide/chemical containers.

No paint containers or Styrofoam of any kind, rubber hoses, flower pots.

No plastic toys of any kind, coolers, electronics, drain pipes or tool boxes.

ALL FOOD CONTAINERS/PACKAGING MUST BE RINSED CLEAN OF FOOD DEBRIS.

As you know, it is the law and Haworth's ordinance calls for recycling of all paper, aluminum, cans, bottles, plastics, and more. **Please take advantage of the Household Hazardous Waste and Tire and Computers/Electronics Collection Days, which are provided by the Bergen County Utilities Authority.**
