LEASHING OF DOGS

All dogs must be leashed when on public streets, in parks or any public place and are not permitted to run at large in any public area or on any private property other than that of the owner.

OWNERS ARE REQUIRED TO CLEAN UP AFTER THEIR PETS IN A PROMPT AND SANITARY MANNER - VIOLATORS WILL RECEIVE A SUMMONS.

Residents should be putting all yard debris in open containers CURBSIDE for Monday grass and yard debris pick up.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS



The Department of Public Works has cleaned many of the Borough lots of the debris, overgrowth, limbs and dead trees that have made these areas unsightly. As we have worked to improve these areas, and Ordinance No. 810 prohibits dumping on public property, and calls for fines of \$250.00

to \$500.00, we would ask you to please not dump in these areas. Also, if you see someone dumping, PLEASE call the police immediately. This will save Haworth residents a great deal of money and help keep Haworth looking beautiful.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT:

1. DO NOT MIX - METAL - WIRE - TREE ROOTS - TREE STUMPS - FIREWOOD - DIRT VINES - POISON IVY - STICKERS OR ROCKS WITH BRANCHES. They are very dangerous to the workers, residents and machine.
2. Place all branches on your front lawn with the ends facing towards the street. They should be cut into lengths between 3 and 6 feet. Pieces under 3 feet are too small and do not reach the chipper blades. Branches under 3 feet in length and 2 inches in diameter or less should be placed in an open container at the curb for pickup by the garbage contractor with grass pick-up.
3. If tree work is done by persons not residing in the household, that person must dispose of the branches.

ATTENTION!!!!

Some property owners may not be aware of the public easement area (usually about ten ft. wide) along the roadway abutting their property. This is for sidewalk purposes, whether or not there is actually a sidewalk there. The DPW has experienced injury to its personnel & damage to its equipment because of encumbrances placed along the roadway. **BASKETBALL HOOPS IN THE STREET ARE ILLEGAL AND SUBJECT THE OWNER TO A LAWSUIT IF ANYONE IS HURT. IF YOU HAVE PLACED ROCKS, SHRUBS, OR BASKETBALL HOOPS ALONG THE ROADWAY, THEY MUST BE REMOVED.**

PROPANE TANKS Please bring propane tanks to the Household Hazardous Waste Collections (1 lb. And 20 lb. tanks only) or contact either Modern Propane located on Route 46 West in Lodi, NJ (973) 778-0812 or Suburban Propane located on Route 17, Mahwah, NJ (201) 529-3500 for propane tank removal. Thank you for your cooperation.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES: Battery collection practices have changed in New Jersey due to regulatory changes and less hazardous battery compositions. Batteries that must be recycled are rechargeable batteries found in cell phones, cordless phones, cordless power tools, laptop computers, digital cameras and remote-control toys. The label on the battery will indicate if it is rechargeable. If it says "Alkaline", dispose of it in the trash.

Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at participating retail locations including the following: Radio Shack, Best Buy, Staples, Target, Office Max, Lowes, Home Depot, Sears, Wal-Mart and Verizon Wireless. To find a retail collection site, use the collection site locator at www.call2recycle.org or call the consumer helpline at 877-2-RECYCLE.

DID YOU KNOW.....

Best Buy will recycle most consumer electronics, including televisions and monitors up to 32 inches, desktop computers, notebooks, videocassette recorders, DVD players and phones.

HAWORTH VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE CORPS

The Haworth Volunteer Ambulance Corps wishes our residents a happy and safe summer. We would like to remind everyone that during the summer months, it is important to maintain safe practices when participating in outdoor activities. Please follow these precautions:

1. Hydrate – it is important to replenish fluids (preferably water) during hot, humid days!
2. Sunscreen – apply frequently when outdoors using a broad-spectrum product that protects against both UV A and B with a SPF factor of at least 30. After swimming or sweating, please remember to re-apply. Medical information commonly available indicates the use of SPF of greater than 30 provides only minor incremental benefit, so use your judgement based upon your personal skin condition, and preference.
3. Helmets – even though the summer temperatures may be high, it is important (and mandatory for children under the age of 17) to wear a certified helmet for protection against falls when bicycling or skateboarding. Of course it is also mandatory for anyone on a motorcycle to wear a helmet.
4. Walking and hiking – please be aware of your surroundings, some trails may not be maintained and cleared of Poison Ivy, Oak, or Sumac. Please learn how to identify these weeds and avoid contact with them. If you do come in contact with them, remember to wash thoroughly to remove the irritating oils.
5. Vehicle safety – please do not leave children or pets unattended in vehicles. The temperature in vehicles rapidly increases in closed vehicles to dangerous levels.

As always, the HVAC is urgently seeking volunteers as either Drivers or EMTs. All necessary training is provided free of charge. All residents are welcome and encouraged to visit

your Ambulance Building at 271 Park Street and meet the members on Sunday mornings from 10 AM to Noon.



HAWORTH SENIORS

Do you live alone and do you know about Operation Reassurance? This program is part of the Haworth Police Department. When you sign up for this program, they will give you a number to call each morning before 10:00. If they do not hear from you, they will call you, and if they do not get an answer, they will come to your home to check on you. Did you check the batteries in your smoke alarms lately? The Haworth Fire Department and Bonnie Borghi of Helping Hands (201-387-0322) will gladly help you if you need to replace your batteries. You also need to have carbon monoxide detectors in your home located within ten feet from any sleeping areas. If you need further information on this, contact Margaret at the Borough Hall (201-384-4785) and she'll gladly mail you a copy of the regulations. Bonnie will also help with replacing light bulbs.

REMINDER: YOU MUST SEPARATE YOUR BOTTLES & CANS FROM YOUR PAPER. TWO DIFFERENT TRUCKS COME TO PICK UP YOUR RECYCLING.

The more you recycle, the better it is for the environment and for your tax bill.

Paper Products including coffee cups, newspapers, magazines, catalogues, junk mail, coupons, envelopes (plastic windows need not be removed), writing paper, printer paper, gift wrap, tissue paper, brown paper bags, gift bags, books, hard cover books, paperbacks, telephone books, cardboard egg cartons, cardboard and corrugated boxes, **including PIZZA boxes**, unsoiled paper towels and napkins. **NO SHREDDED PAPER.**

Plastic of any size or shape with numbers 1, 2 or 5 only. **NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND, FROZEN FOOD MICROWAVE TRAYS, FOOD TRAYS OR PARTY PLATTERS.**

NO STYROFOAM OF ANY KIND.

NO WAX CARDBOARD.

Glass, including jars & bottles. **NO PLATE GLASS or LIGHT BULBS.**

Aluminum, steel & tin in the form of cans (coffee, soda, tennis ball, pet food, etc.) aluminum foil, metal bottle caps, pie tins, foil wrappers for candy and snack bars. **NO METAL HANGERS.**

ALL FOOD CONTAINERS/PACKAGING MUST BE RINSED CLEAN OF FOOD DEBRIS.
REMEMBER - WE ARE BEING PAID FOR ALL RECYCLED ITEMS WHICH REDUCES YOUR TAXES.

As you know, it is the law and Haworth's ordinance calls for recycling of all paper, aluminum, cans, bottles, plastics, and more. **Please take advantage of the Household Hazardous Waste and Tire and Computers/Electronics Collection Days, which are provided by the Bergen County Utilities Authority.**






